

# Footnote examples\*

The standard LaTeX document classes `article`, `report` and `book`, the macro `\maketitle` \lets `\footnote` to `\thanks` and footnote marks are taken from a specified list of symbols. (In the AMS classes<sup>1</sup> the title footnote marks will appear only in the footnote itself at the bottom of the page.)

Footnotes after `\maketitle` use by default numeric markers beginning at 1, in some form<sup>a</sup> smaller than lining numbers. (Footnotes in minipages use lowercase letters<sup>b</sup> as markers.)

<sup>a</sup>Best not using scaled-down lining figures.

<sup>b</sup>italic except in KOMA classes
